With an IT résumé dating back to the Mulroneys era, Gerald has nearly completed a career reboot in the Computer Systems Technology program at Camosun College.

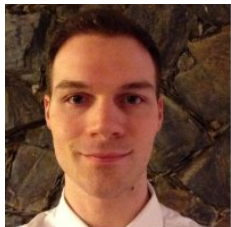
